
# HOW TO CHOOSE THE RIGHT TRAVEL AGENT

#### 1. Consider choosing a home-based travel agent

### 2. What you need to write down before you talk to a travel agent

- Date, Place, and price range for your trip
- List of questions

# 3. Ask the right questions

#### **Sample questions:**

- What kind of travel do you specialize in?
- Can I contact you 24 hours a day?
- Which services if any do you charge for and how much will they cost?

## 4. A good quality travel agent will ask you to outline your trip

They will (or at least they should) ask the following:

- Where you're going and why
- How you wish to travel (air, land or sea)
- How long you plan to stay
- What your travel budget is

<sup>\*\*</sup> Remember to be open and honest with your answers. A good agent will gladly put together a couple of options that outline transportation, accommodations, and estimated costs that fit your budget.

#### 5. A good travel agent will always take your needs into consideration

While an agent will typically ask questions to get this type of information from you (and you should take it as a bad sign if the agent doesn't), you will also need to do your part by speaking your mind and effectively communicating your needs.

#### Tips to follow:

- Clarify the main purpose of your trip
- Decide where you want to go and when, making sure the trip will fit into everyone's plan
- Choose your mode of transportation, whether it's airline, cruise, rental car, or something else
- Try to determine a realistic budget for your trip based on all your other considerations

# 6. Before agreeing to purchase travel through a travel agent keep these guidelines in mind

- Do not rely on verbal agreements alone. Get the details in writing
- Do your research! If you are not familiar with a certain hotel, resort, airline, cruise line, or other mode of transportation the travel agent is suggesting, do a quick google search to check it out
- Always READ all the paperwork CAREFULLY before you sign it, especially when it comes to package deals
- If you book early enough and are able to take advantage of a vendor that offers a payment plan, make sure you FULLY understand when the payments are due, and any penalties imposed for late payments and cancellations. Your travel agent should have no problem explaining any of the financial responsibilities associated with your vacation in detail
- It is customary for a travel agent to request that you fill out and sign a credit card authorization form, a copy of the front and back or your credit/debit card, as well as copy of your driver's license. This is for your protection and the travel agent's protection and you should run the other way if they bypass this step. We live in an identity theft society so this ensures that you are not only the person authorizing payment for this purchase but the person named on the credit/debit card.
